WESTMINSTER CATECHISM

Question 30: How does the Spirit apply to us the redemption purchased by Christ?

Answer: The Spirit applies to us the redemption purchased by Christ, by working faith in us, and uniting us to Christ in our effectual calling.

Scripture: Ephesians 1:13-14; 2:18; 3:17.

Romans 12:5-8: so we, *being* many, are one body in Christ, and individually members of one another. Having then gifts differing according to the grace that is given to us, *let us use them*: if prophecy, *let us prophesy* in proportion to our faith; or ministry, *let us use it in our ministering*; he who teaches, in teaching; *He who exhorts, in exhortation*; he who gives, with liberality; he who leads, with diligence; he who shows mercy, with cheerfulness.

Paul passes on from the idea of membership in the church to the actual gift given each member as a part of the body of Christ. The Greek word for "gifts" is charismata, translated "grace", or "free gift". Are all the gifts the same? No, they are different. How do they differ? Paul through the Spirit says that they differ according to the grace that is given us.
