“Walking Honestly”

Romans 13:13-14 <sup>13</sup> *Let us walk properly, as in the day, not in revelry and drunkenness, not in lewdness and lust, not in strife and envy.*  
<sup>14</sup> *But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to fulfill its lusts.*

Paul in verse 13 wants us to walk properly—honestly, honorably, becomingly, dently, beautifully—all are adverbs that fit with the thought of the Greek word. Paul explains that this will involve not reveling or being drunken, and also not involved in immorality. Those are sins that do not let you walk properly.

Verse 14 provides the final exhortation. To succeed we must put on the Lord Jesus Christ and not make provision for the flesh. We are to be dead to the flesh anyway as believers, so that is reinforced that we should as we put on Christ remove that which keeps us from putting on Christ.

Two passages illustrate what will be our attitude if we put on Christ:

(1) Luke 20:19-26 point that Jesus attitude toward the government was that you obey the powers that be in the things where they have a right to command you. This was the occasion of rendering taxes to Caesar.

(2) John 18:11 and Matthew 26:52 both teach our Lord's submission to human government when they came to arrest Him. Peter was told here not to take up the sword against the government.
