“The Author and Recipient of Third John”

III John 1

The Elder, To the beloved Gaius, whom I love in truth:

As in II John, the Apostle once again refers to himself as “the Elder.” This no doubt refers to the office which he held in the church at Ephesus. Thus John reminds the one to whom he writes of his position of authority and influence.

The recipient is the “beloved Gaius,” a designation that would cause one to find Gaius to be a person that people just loved. John will enumerate the characteristics that illustrate the character of Gaius in verses 5-8, which show the worthiness of such a designation. Gaius was no doubt a member of one of the churches that John established or preached in.

John concludes with a declaration of his own personal attitude toward Gaius, describing him as one “whom I love in truth.” Christian love is the product of truth dwelling in the believer. John had also used this same assertion concerning the elect lady of II John.
